

No Bake Moses Basket Cookies

2 cups sugar
1 stick of butter
1/2 cup of milk
1/3 cup baking cocoa
3 cups old fashioned oats (uncooked)
Candy to represent Baby Moses (i.e.
head and small marshmallow for body)

Instructions

1. Combine sugar, butter, milk and cocoa in a large saucepan and bring to a light boil.
2. Stirring frequently, boil for 3 minutes then remove from heat.
3. Stir in oats and allow to cool for 5 minutes.
4. Scoop with Tablespoon and drop oatmeal mixture on waxed paper.
5. Gently put Moses in the basket by pressing candy on top of each cookie.
6. Allow time to firm. Enjoy!


We've all spent a lot of quality family time during quarantine. Here are some fun questions to see how well kids know their parents. Pull these out at dinner time to liven up your talk around the table.

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Obstacle Course



Moses had to listen to God. Sometimes following God's will is like running an obstacle course. You don't know where you'll end up, but if you listen to God's voice in your heart and follow His will, you'll get to the other side!

Materials:

- Chairs and tables
- Blindfold

Before Class Prep:

Create an obstacle course in your house using furniture, chairs, pillows, etc...

How to Play:

Blindfold one person.

Moses was just out tending his family's flock of sheep when God told him that he was to complete the important task of leading the Israelites out of Egypt!

Have one person direct the blindfolded person with only four words: left, right, forward and backward.

The blindfolded person must walk through the obstacle course, listening to the commands and trying not to bump into any of the furniture chairs. Each bump gives the child one point. The leader can call out the bumps as they happen and tally them on the board.

The person with the fewest points wins.
