

## Sticky Bun Muffins

In this week's Bible lesson Ruth and Naomi chose to stick together. Enjoy these sticky buns and talk about how friends and family "stick together."

### Prep:

15 mins

Cook: 25 mins

Makes:

2 dozen muffins

### Ingredients

½ cup white sugar

1 tablespoon ground cinnamon

3 (10 ounce) cans refrigerated biscuit dough, separated and cut into quarters

¾ cup brown sugar

½ cup margarine



### Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease muffin cups or line with paper liners.
2. Mix white sugar and cinnamon together in a gallon-size resealable bag; add biscuits and toss to coat. Press coated biscuits into muffin cups, about 2/3 full.
3. Heat brown sugar and margarine together in a saucepan over medium-low heat until melted, 3 to 5 minutes; pour over each biscuit muffin.
4. Bake in the preheated oven until dough is cooked through, about 20 minutes.

### Tip

Melt the butter in a measuring cup in the microwave and then stir in the brown sugar. The heat of the butter melts the brown sugar. You can also add raisins and/or chopped nuts.

# DIY Puffy Sidewalk Paint

Here is a fun way to make your sidewalk artwork stand out. It's easy and takes just a few ingredients that you probably already have!

## Supplies Needed:

1 cup flour  
1 cup water  
1/2 cup shaving cream  
food coloring or washable paint  
gallon freezer bags  
plastic squirt bottles [Here are some on Amazon](#)

## Directions

1. Inside a gallon-sized freezer bag, mix flour and water together so there are no clumps.
2. Add 10 drops of food coloring or paint and 1/2 cup shaving cream. Close baggie and mix well using your hands on the outside of the bag
3. Cut the end of the bag and pipe mixture into the bottle. Don't cut the end too large or it will be difficult to get into the bottle.
4. Secure lid and squeeze onto the sidewalk to draw with. Keep some toothpicks nearby in case the squirt bottles get plugged with a clump of flour.

Just FYI food coloring may stain, so wash off sidewalk when done



## Prayer Rocks

I love the kindness rock project that was all the craze a few years ago. Kids painted rocks and left them in parks and other places for people to find. Let's bring back a different version of this and remind people to pray.

### Supplies:

Palm size smooth rocks

Paint pens, chalk markers, or sharpies


Paint

Paint brushes

Paper towels and water for clean up

### Steps:


- Start by going on a walk and collecting some nice flat stones. Bring them home and wash the dirt off.
- Paint your rocks with brightly colored paint on one side and let dry before flipping it over and painting the other side.. This is something even younger kids can do and parents can help with the writing.
- After rocks are dry, use your paint pens, sharpie or chalk markers to write PRAY on your rocks.
- Take your rocks to parks or other public outside places and hide them for others to find or leave them on a neighbor's porch to remind everyone to pray!
